The children nominate themselves for School Council and are then voted into position through our Polling Day within the school hall. Children are democratically voted for Digital Leaders and Reading Leaders. Children vote for their next class text. In Autumn 1 within PSHE, Y6 answer the question 'why do we vote?' This increases understanding of the democratic process. Y6 children buddy up with reception children to be good role models and teach them respect and good manners. Y6 children complete Safe Skills.
