Fundamental British Values in Year 4

The Year 4 children take part in Collective Worship daily. This enables the children to reflect and discuss various topics – including each of the five Fundamental British Values. Our assembly timetable also covers a wide genre of topics, including discrete FBV assemblies, as well as topics that link. The children watch Newsround daily, which includes topics relevant to the FBVs.

In Summer 2 within Geography, Y4 answer the question 'how can we look after our environment?' This emphasises the importance of respecting the world around us. In Autumn within RE, Y4 answer the question 'what does it mean to be a Hindu in Britain today?' This increases understanding and tolerance of the Hindu religion. In Spring 1 within RE, Y4 answer the question 'what can we learn from religions about deciding what is right and wrong?' This increases tolerance of different religion. In Summer 1 within RE, Y4 focus on EID. This increases knowledge, understanding and tolerance of the Muslim faith. 	 The children receive a whole school assembly all about Individual Liberty. Our Y4 children are able to collect points for their Key Stage Two Children's University extracurricular passports. Children are able to choose what clubs they want to go to. Our Y4 children's achievements, both home and in school, are celebrated. In Summer 1 within PSHE, Y4 focus on the importance of good sleep for development.
