Black History Month

“In the Spotlight”

For Black History Month, we’re highlighting Dr. Patricia Bath, an incredible woman whose work helped change the way we take care of our eyes. Born in 1942, Dr. Bath grew up wanting to make a difference in people’s lives through medicine. She became the first African American woman to complete a residency in ophthalmology, the field of medicine that focuses on eye health.

But Dr. Bath didn’t stop there. She noticed that many Black people were losing their sight due to preventable diseases, so she worked hard to make sure everyone had access to proper eye care. Her most remarkable achievement was inventing a special tool called the “Laserphaco Probe,” which helped remove cataracts and restore vision. This invention has been used around the world and has helped countless people see again.

Dr. Bath’s legacy lives on as a brilliant scientist and a compassionate doctor who believed that everyone, no matter their background, deserved the gift of sight.

She broke barriers in medicine and inspired others to believe in the power of science and innovation.
